Dear Mt. Carmel Family and Friends,

Last month the General Conference of the United Methodist Church met and made some significant decisions. The one that received the most attention was the removal of the language in the Book of Discipline (rule book of the denomination) that had restricted LGBTQ+ persons from being ordained and denied clergy from performing same-sex weddings. There were several changes and updates in the Social Principles of the church including things like Climate Change that had not been in there before. Another major change was a move away from a long history of colonialism that separated the church in the U.S. from others around the world who were placed in central (or regional) conferences. The adopted proposal which will subsequently require the approval of 2/3rds of the annual conferences around the world will make the church in the U.S. its own regional conference on a similar level as the other regional conferences around the world.

This summer I want to gather people together to talk about these changes and maybe a class for those who would like to study and discuss the Social Principles and how we might implement some of them in our ministry here at Mt. Carmel. Feel free to call me or email me if you have specific questions or concerns as we move forward.

The Church Council and I are in the process of rewriting a document first written by Pastor Jenny and the council after the 2019 General Conference. **On Sunday, June 2nd at 12:15pm** people are invited to stay for a time of sharing questions and comments about where we are as a congregation in regard to these changes, and where we go from here. A second opportunity for those who may be gone for the weekend will be on **Thursday, June 6th at 7:30pm.** Please prayerfully read this document and come join us as we discuss it. Further Along On Our Way Forward

Following the changes made at the General Conference meeting a month ago the Church council has been rewording a document Pastor Jenny and the council had written after the 2019 conference.

A second opportunity for those who may be gone for the weekend will be **on Thursday, June 6 at 7:30pm.** Please prayerfully read this document and come join us as we discuss it.

Further Along on Our Way Forward: A Statement of Clarity and Encouragement from the Leadership of Mt. Carmel UMC to our Congregation and Community.

Given the outcomes of the postponed 2020 Session of General Conference of the United Methodist Church held April 23-May 3, 2024, we feel called to offer these assurances to all who worship, grow, and serve as a part of our Mt. Carmel community.

Mt. Carmel has come a long way since the stone chapel was built in 1854 with two front doors so that men would come in and sit on one side and women would come in and sit on the other side. Back then only men could be licensed or ordained as pastors.

Mt. Carmel continues to be a house of prayer and service for all God's people. All persons are of sacred worth and value and will be welcomed, loved, and respected in our community. All persons are welcome to be immersed in God's grace at baptism, to be fed through Holy Communion, to celebrate in worship, to grow through discipleship and to serve. No person will be excluded from any ministry or mission because of race, gender, marital status, age, sexual orientation, or citizenship status.

Mt. Carmel is intentionally and unapologetically a place where persons are encouraged to continually seek God's direction and to refine convictions regarding personal holiness and social justice. We reject notions that lump persons into camps or that politicize spiritual and ethical matters; rather, we challenge our worshipers to engage in rigorous ethical discernment that is grounded in scripture and informed by tradition, experience, and reason. We recognize that we are not yet perfected in knowledge and, thus, we can come to different conclusions. Uniformity is not our goal; rather, it is our desire that each of us, in our convictions, can become Christ-like in our love of others.

We acknowledge that General Conference removed our denomination's restrictions regarding same gender marriage and the ordination of LGTBQIA persons. We recognize that our denomination will continue to wrestle with how best to minister to and with LGTBQIA persons in the next several years. We will continue to pray for our church. We hope the denomination and individual congregations, pastors and lay members will acknowledge the larger conversations regarding diversity in Biblical interpretation and contextual ministry realities as we move forward.

Finally, we encourage all who worship and serve on our hill to remember who we are! We do not define ourselves as a single segment of the church, rather, we are Christians seeking higher ground where God's will can emerge! We are a diverse people hoping to witness to the power of the gospel as we move hand in hand from the altar where we are nourished into the community we are called to love and serve!

We are honored, as always to share this holy journey with each of you.

Finance Team **Report**

Tax-Advantaged Methods to Contribute to Mt. Carmel

Most of our congregation uses several current methods to contribute to Mt. Carmel—Vanco, check, or cash. I want to make you aware of several other methods that might provide tax advantages depending on your personal situation.

1. Direct gifting of stock – Mt. Carmel has recently established a brokerage account with our bank that allows for the gifting of appreciated stock to the church. This has the advantage of avoiding the payment of capital gains taxes while still allowing for a possible deduction on your income taxes.

2.Donating through a Donor Advised Fund – this method requires that you establish a Donor Advised Fund through a brokerage such as Vanguard, Fidelity or another. Once established, you fund the Donor Advised Fund which can be done through a variety of means. Once funded, you can make grants to Mt. Carmel – either one time or on a recurring basis. This has the advantage of enabling a sizable charitable contribution deduction on your income taxes in the year that the Donor Advised Fund is funded while allowing you to take the standard deduction in subsequent years. It also allows you to avoid capital gains taxes if your use appreciated stock to fund the Donor Advised Fund.

3.Making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) – For those who are 70.5 years or older, you may make a QCD to Mt. Carmel from your IRA (not your 401K or 403b).A QCD can satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) requirement from your IRA. The benefit of a QCD is that it is not counted as income thus lowering your adjustable gross income on your taxes. By lowering your adjustable gross income you may also keep your Medicare premiums in a lower bracket.

4.Naming Mt. Carmel in your will – while not a topic most of us like to think about, on your passing you may make one final contribution to Mt. Carmel by designating part of your estate to go to Mt. Carmel. This has the possible benefit of lowering any inheritance taxes that your heirs may face.

5.Designate Mt. Carmel as a beneficiary on your life insurance policy – if you have life insurance, you may designate Mt. Carmel as a beneficiary on that policy.
