Coming into Holy Week is not the best time to be recovering, but I have been blessed by the way people have stepped up and offered their help and support with home-cooked meals and car rides as needed. With your and God's help I know we will get through this.

Easter Offering

(For two ministries in our area)

Migrants being bussed to D.C. from Texas. The Hispanic/Latino Ministries of the Baltimore-Washington Conference has launched a campaign to raise \$45,000 to assist migrants being bussed to Washington, D.C. Despite the Conference having already raised \$50,000, needs continue to be significant for the ministry. Over 1,000 families have settled in the D.C. region since April of 2022. The Baltimore-Washington Conference continues to welcome the new neighbors with radical hospitality and solidarity. The Washington migrant family shelters stopped accepting new families in April 2023, which means women and children are being put out in the streets with many living in the cars of families in the shelters. We are called to welcome and assist the sojourner. The Baltimore-Washington Conference, Capitol Hill UMC, and Beacon of Light at Emory UMC in D.C. have been working with the Migrant Solidarity Mutual Aid (MSMA), to support migrants arriving in D.C. The Rescue Mission of Frederick, MD In 1964, the Frederick Rescue Mission opened with a desire to make an impact on our community in need. What began with a thrift store and 10-bed shelter for homeless men has expanded to touch the lives of tens of thousands of people in our community over the years. In 1984, the Mission moved to the heart of downtown Frederick and transformed the building that once served as the Frederick County jail into a place where people can be free to experience hope and healing. Over the next decade, the Bread of Life Community Kitchen opened in keeping with Christ's ministry of feeding the hungry. Still today, we offer breakfast and lunch – 7 days a week – to the hungry and the homeless. In addition to daily breakfast and dinner, we provide no-cost groceries for our community to take home and share with their families, allowing us to serve greater numbers of people in need. We recognized that many of those who came to our table also struggled with addiction. The Changed Life Recovery Program was created to address the core issues of addiction by helping to heal the body and mind.

Finance Team Update

As many heard, Mt. Carmel was able to make the first \$100,000 principal reduction payment towards our mortgage in February. That leaves a balance of \$1.55 Million which, while still a daunting number, is not beyond our goal of paying off the mortgage in the next ten years. We are hopeful that with the capital campaign pledges we received, Mt. Carmel will be able to make a second \$100,000 principal reduction payment before the end of the year. A quick update on our financial situation (thru February) is summarized below:

Total Income \$58,987
Total Expenses \$53,103
Net Income \$5,884

Additionally, Mt. Carmel has established a new way to give your capital campaign or other donations. If you wish to gift appreciated stock, Mt. Carmel has established a brokerage account with our bank, ACNB, where the stock can be sent and they will sell it and deposit the funds into Mt. Carmel's account. 


Have you seen the children's Prayer
