Missions

Hope 4 Kids Mission

Hope 4 Kids is a weekend food program started in 2012 by Mt Carmel and New Market UMC. It provides a weekend package of food to children in our community. School staff identify the needs of these children. Every week, a pack of food is sent home with the child to ensure they have a consistent source of nutrition on days they do not receive school meals.

During the 2023-2024 school year, Hope 4 Kids served around 90 students each week. Those schools served are: Deer Crossing Elementary School, New Market Elementary School, New Market Middle School, Oakdale Elementary School, Oakdale Middle School, and Blue Heron Elementary School.

How Can You Support This Important Mission?

There are several ways you can support Hope 4 Kids. Food for this program is purchased through the Maryland Food Bank and local stores. It takes around \$15,000 to fund Hope 4 Kids for the school year. Right now, the they have about \$2000. Several community groups also financially support this mission. If you would like to help, make checks payable to Mt Carmel and put Hope 4 Kids in the memo.

You can also help by volunteering to help pack the bags or pick up food at the MD Food Bank or Sam's Club. Both orders are large and can take two vehicles to take the food to New Market UMC.

You can also help by attending the monthly packing times. All packings take place at New Market UMC in the yellow schoolhouse on the second Tuesday of each month at 6pm.

Mission Trip to Puerto Rico

Our first stop on the island was to have Sunday lunch together and explore historic downtown San Juan. Though it was warm, according to my weather app, it was even warmer in Frederick. However, the humidity was much higher in Puerto Rico! Fortunately, the church where we were staying was air-conditioned. They blessed us with a taco dinner and then we had orientations, a review of rules and safety precautions, and even a fire drill. There was a time for learning about our theme for the week (which coincided with my sermon the following Sunday about being rooted and grounded in God's love. We closed each day with worship and individual church group time.

Throughout the week we did our mission work in teams made up of a mixture of youth and adults from three different youth groups there that week. Typically, we worked from 9-3 with both lunch and water breaks. Some of us painted a couple of individual houses helped sort and pack medicines for medical missions in Puerto Rico or Cuba, and packed and delivered food to hungry people in a poorer neighborhood near the church. By Thursday we got all of our work done, made new friends from the island and from other youth groups who were there, and grew deeper in our faith. We worshiped God together and heard individual testimonies one night and shared a powerful expression of serving with an experience of foot washing.
